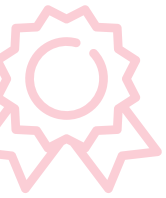

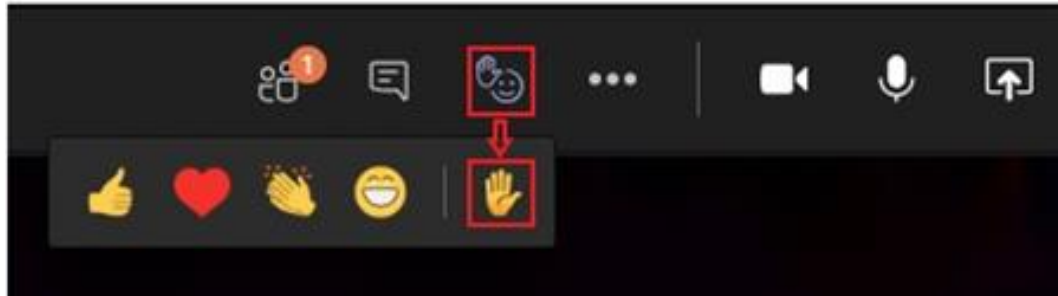
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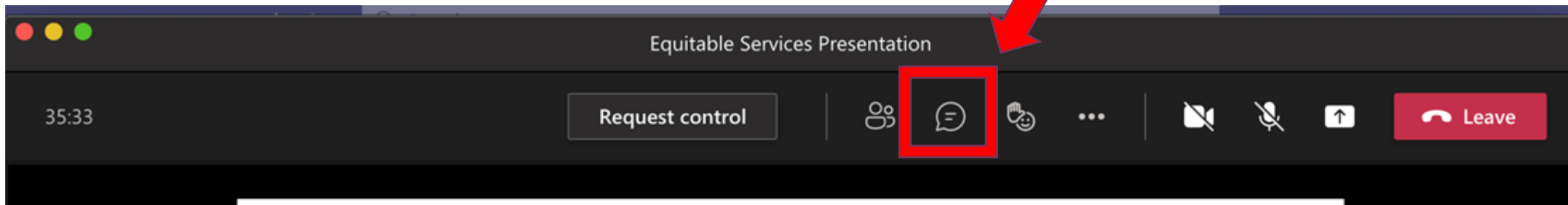

McKinney-Vento Allowable Use of Funds

McKinney-Vento Subgrant Authorized Activities

- Subtitle VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (per Title IX, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act) authorizes the following allowable usages of McKinney-Vento local educational agency subgrant funds:

- Tutoring, supplemental instruction, enriched educational services
- Expedited evaluation of the strengths and needs of homeless students
- Professional development and other activities for educators and other specialized instructional support
- Referral services for medical, dental, mental, and other health services

- Appropriate early childhood education programs
- Attract, engage, and retain homeless children and youth in public school programs and services
- Before and after school, mentoring, summer programs
- Fees associated with tracking, obtaining, and transferring necessary records to enroll homeless children and youth
- Education and training to the parents and guardians of homeless children and youth

- Coordination between schools and agencies providing services to homeless children and youths
- Specialized instructional supports and referrals for services
- Activities to address the needs of homeless children and youths from situations of domestic violence and parental mental health or substance abuse problems
- Purchase supplies for any non-school facilities

- Purchase of school supplies
- Extraordinary or emergency assistance needed to enable homeless children and youths to attend school and participate fully in school activities.

- Services provided under this program are not intended to replace the regular academic program. Funds from this grant can be used to supplement existing services, but they cannot be used to supplant services which the LEA has been providing through other means.
- Programs can either expand or improve services provided through a school's general academic program but cannot replace that program (supplement not supplant). To extent practicable, activities and services are to integrate homeless and non-homeless students.


