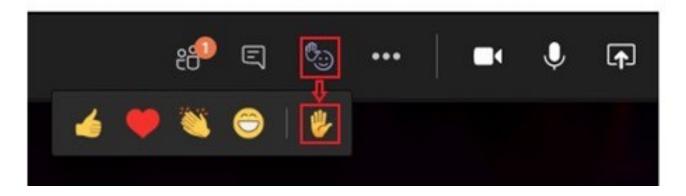

- Include the accurate benefit rates; be mindful that the health insurance premiums will increase in December 2022



- Current period federal budget/expenditure reports by locations
- Any other documentation needed to complete the FY23 CFPA



Things to Remember



- The LEA must ensure all budgeted items are:
 - Reasonable
 - Necessary
 - Allocable
 - Allowable



- Supplements Not Supplants Requirements (Title I, Title II, Title III, Title IV, Title V)
- ALL ESEA programs are supplemental, and funds must be used in a supplemental manner

- Location codes must be placed with the appropriate allocation, including non-public/private schools.
- No product names should be mentioned. Generic names should be used such as interventionists, laptops, tablets, online intervention programs, etc.
- If the LEA does not have a descriptive narrative, it must have the statement, "The LEA will update the narrative in Revision #1."



- School allocations (PPA List) should align with Budget
 Overview for the School budget
- Pay specific details to function code, object code, location, and quantity



- Ensure items are budgeted in the right function/object code (See Accounting Manual for School District as a reference https://www.mdek12.org/OSF/AccountingManual)
 - Function 1105: Pre-K
 - Function 1260: After School
 - Function 1295: Equitable Service
 - Function 2210: Support for Instructional Staff



- Function 2330: Administration
- Function 2800: Recruitment and Retention
- Function 3900: Parental Engagement



- LEAs must budget enough funds by functions, objects, and locations in each program to ensure sufficient reimbursements until January 2023.
- A revision will not be processed until after December 13, 2022.





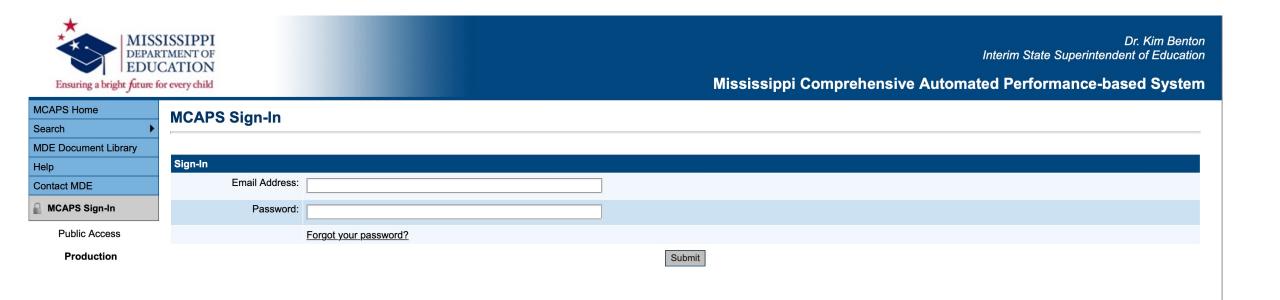

Transferring Funds



ESEA/ESSA allows LEAs the flexibility to target Federal funds to the programs and activities that most effectively address the unique needs of LEAs. An LEA may transfer funds, to better address local identified needs, from the following programs:

- Title II, Part A Supporting Effective Instruction
- Title IV, Part A Student Support and Academic Enrichment grants



Transfers to ESEA Programs are FINAL (Cannot un-transfer the fund once it is transferred into a program)

- Cannot transfer funds OUT of Title I except to Neglected
- 2. Title II transfer to Title I and transfer to Title IV
- 3. Title IV transfer to Title I and transfer to Title II

Transfers = New Allocation

- Title I allocation is \$475,000 and the LEA transfer \$50,000 from Title II, then the new Title I allocation is \$525,000
- If Title IV, Part A allocation is greater than \$30,000 prior to any transfer, the LEA must adhere to the proportional requirement of Title IV, Part A



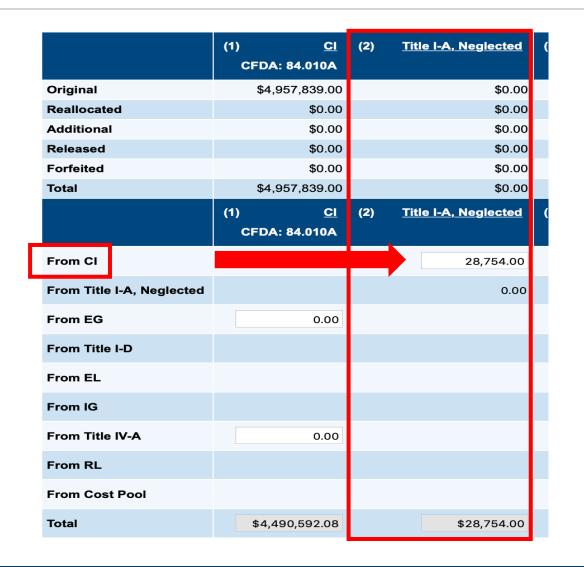
- If the LEA has a Title I-A Neglected preliminary allocation, the LEA must transfer the funds from Title I-A to Title I-A Neglected.
- The amount can exceed the preliminary allocation, but not less than the preliminary allocation.
 - If the transfer amount exceeds the preliminary allocation, maintain sufficient documentation to support the amount transferred.

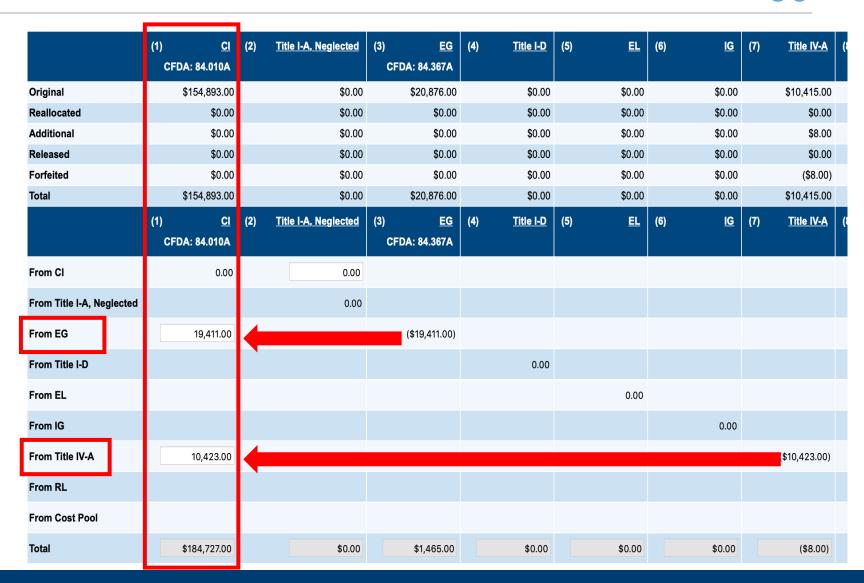

- Cost Pool is not a program, it is a funding source (Fund 2290) to consolidate the administration of federal programs.
- The LEA will need to transfer funds into the Cost Pool from the allocation page in order to open the Cost Pool application in MCAPS.

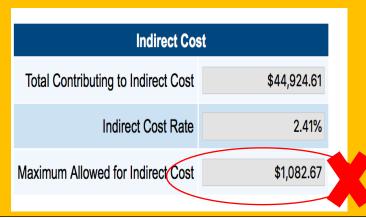

Free and Reduce Lunch Program (FRLP)- The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is a federally assisted meal program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential childcare institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free lunches to children each school day.



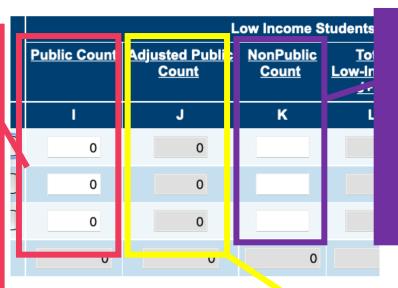
Direct Certification (DC)- Direct certification is a process conducted by the states and by local educational agencies (LEAs) to certify eligible children for free meals without the need for household applications. The 2004 Child Nutrition and WIC Reauthorization Act required LEAs to establish systems to directly certify children from households that receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits by school year.



Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)- The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is a non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas. CEP allows the nation's highest poverty schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications.



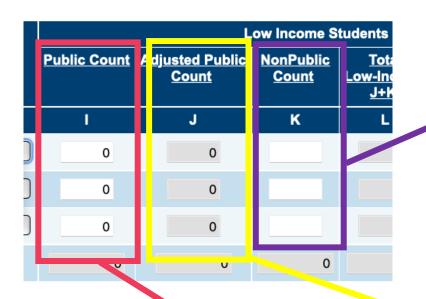
