



Varying Family Configurations

Here are just a few recent statistics on the family make-up in the United States in recent years.

- The percentage of working mothers has increased from 9% in 1940 to 78.9% in 2009.
- As evidence in 2014, 41 percent of children born in the United States are born to single mothers.
- Of the 75 millions children living in the U.S. under the age of 18, 24.3 percent (or 18.1 million) live with their mothers only; 54% of those children are under the age of 9.
- In a study examining paternal involvement over the first ten years of a child's life, researchers found the father child contact was associated with better social emotional and academic functioning.
- Across the U.S., 75 million children live in home with their grandparents. 4.9 million live in homes where grandparents are the head of household. 1 million live with grandparents who are their primary caregivers.



Family Wealth

The relative wealth of American Households has also experienced negative change recently.




- In 2013, children represented 23.5% of the total population and 32.3% of people in poverty
- Children are by far the fastest growing segments of the total homeless population.
- 45% of homeless children and youth (K-12) were not attending school on a regular basis during their homelessness.
- Throughout the U.S., federal spending on housing assistance programs targeted at low-income populations is less than 50% of 1976 spending levels.



Family Stressors

A family's configuration and lack of wealth can cause them a great deal of stress.



- Many parents are working more hours but have less wealth on a relative basis than their parents.
- Many parents feel it is impossible to find 15 minutes of quality time with their children.
- There has been a sharp increase of American adults who are taking prescription drugs to cope with anxiety, depression, and other social issues.





Parent-Centered vs. Child Centered Family Focus




Negative Past School Experiences



Schools organize public, ritualistic occasions that do not allow for real contact negotiation, or criticism between parent and teachers. Rather they are institutionalized ways of establishing boundaries between insiders (teachers) and interlopers (parents) under the guise of polite conversation and mature cooperation. Parent Teacher Association meetings and open house rituals at the beginning of the school year are contrived occasions that symbolically affirm the idealized parent-school relationships but rarely provide the chance for authentic interaction.
