



Overview & Purpose of ESSA/ESEA



- The Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed into law in December 2015, which reauthorized the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA).
- Authorized under subpart 1 of Title IV, Part A of the ESEA is the Student Support and Academic Enrichment (SSAE) program.
- The SSAE program provides LEAs and schools the flexibility to tailor investments based on the unique needs of their student populations.



Intended to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of State educational agencies (SEAs), local educational agencies (LEAs), and local communities to:

- Provide all students with access to a well-rounded education;
- Improve school conditions for student learning; and
- Improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.

ESEA Section 4101



Comprehensive Needs Assessment



Requirements

- LEAs receiving at least \$30,000 must complete a needs assessment.
- When funding Title IV, Part A activities, LEAs should adhere to distribution requirements (§4106(e)(2)(C-E)).
 - 20% Well-Rounded Education
 - 20% Safe and Healthy Students
 - A portion for the Effective Use of Technology (Of this portion, no more than 15% can be used for infrastructure.
- Prioritize the distribution of funds to schools served by the LEA, or consortium of such agencies (§4106(e)(2)(A)).

- Follow statutory requirements
- Walk LEAs through a data-driven process
- Allow LEAs to leverage existing data
- Provide flexibility to LEAs
- Be accessible to all LEAs



- Built in Excel for accessibility
- Self-contained
- Numbered and colored to reflect 5 steps in the process:
 - 1. Getting ready for assessment (pink)
 - 2. Entering data (yellow)
 - 3. Identifying needs (green)
 - 4. Analyzing needs (purple)
 - 5. Addressing prioritized needs (orange)
